Listening as part of speaking

Theoretical considerations and practical questions of assessing interactive listening

The meeting will be held <u>in person</u> in Salzburg Wednesday 28th of May 2025 (14:00 – 17:00, tentative times tbc)

The event will be divided into two parts.

In the first half, Nivja de Jong, Dylan Burton and Jayanti Banerjee will share theoretical, empirical and practical perspectives on assessing interactive listening skills. Nivja de Jong will present an expanded notion of speaking skills based on recent psycholinguistic and sociolinguistic research incorporating predictive listening. Dylan Burton will share evidence that raters, both trained and linguistic laypersons, naturally orient towards interactive/integrated speaking, and that they do so using a wide range of multimodal evidence. Jayanti Banerjee will discuss and reflect upon how interactive listening has been operationalised in standardised speaking exams.

The second half will be dedicated to discussion. Participants will have the opportunity to reflect on the ideas presented, share their own practices, and explore ways to develop their assessment approaches within their specific contexts.

We look forward to welcoming you in Salzburg for an engaging face-to-face exchange of ideas.
